HOUSE AMENDMENT " A " to H. P. 1985, L. D.
2530, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Elections to the
House of Representatives."

Amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out
everything after the amending clause and inserting
in place thereof the following:

'A primary petition for a candidate for the
House of Representatives must be signed by at
least 25 and not more than 50 voters.'

Further amend said Bill in section 2 by
striking out everything after the amending clause
and inserting in place thereof the following:

'A nomination petition for a candidate for the
House of Representatives must be signed by at
least 25 and not more than 50 voters.'

Statement of Fact

It is the intent of this amendment to strike
the additional provision that nomination petitions
for a candidate in a representative district
entitled to 2 or more representatives be signed by a
number of voters equal to at least 25 and not more
than 50 multiplied by the number of representatives
to which the district is entitled.
