STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Providing for the Biweekly Payment of Wages to State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 10, amended. Section 10 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 10. Payment of wages

All state officers and employees except temporary and seasonal employees shall be paid their salaries or wages weekly biweekly, the dates of payment to be determined by the State Controller. Any state officer, whose salary is established at an annual rate, shall receive weekly biweekly a sum which will, in the year's aggregate, most nearly equal the annual rate. Payment may be made once in each calendar month or fortnightly to such state officers and employees as consent to such time of payment. Temporary and seasonal employees of the State shall be paid at such times as the Commissioner of Finance and Administration shall specify

Sec. 2. Appropriation reduction. There is reduced from the appropriation from the General Fund to the Bureau of Accounts and Control the sum of \$27,750 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975 to carry out the purposes of section 1. The breakdown shall be as follows:
