HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 923, L.D. 2555,  
Bill, "AN ACT Allowing Incorporated Civic  
Organizations to Apply for a Liquor License for  
One Event Per Year."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the  
Title and inserting in place thereof the following:

'AN ACT Relating to Definition of Public Place as  
to Drinking Alcoholic Beverages.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out  
everything after the enacting clause and inserting  
in place thereof the following:

'R. S., T. 17, §2003, sub-§2, amended. Sub-  
section 2 of section 2003 of Title 17 of the  
Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new  
sentence at the end to read as follows:

Except that, for the purposes of this section, any  
dance event sponsored by, or for the sole benefit  
of, any nonprofit organization, hospital  
association, religious association, firemen's  
association or policemen's association shall not  
constitute a public place, provided that such  
dance event is supervised by a law enforcement  
officer.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to permit  
patrons to bring their own liquor to fund-  
raising dances conducted for the benefit of the  
foregoing charitable organizations.
