HOUSE AMENDMENT "C " to S. P. 953, L. D.  
2606, Bill, "AN ACT to Correct Errors and  
Inconsistencies in the Public Laws."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section  
129 the following:

'Sec. 129-A. R. S., T. 29, §2122, amended.  
The first sentence of the 3rd paragraph of  
section 2122 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes  
is amended to read as follows:

The Chief of the State Police or any member of  
the State Police or any law enforcement officer  
in uniform may at any time upon reasonable  
grounds to believe that a vehicle is unsafe  
or not equipped as required by law, or that  
its equipment is not in proper adjustment or  
repair, require the driver of such vehicle to  
proceed to an official inspection station and  
submit such vehicle to an inspection and such  
tests as may be appropriate.'

Statement of Fact

It is inconsistent and irrational that only  
a state policeman can direct a motorist to an  
inspection station. This correction of the law  
would give other law enforcement officers that  
authority.
