SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 4, L. D. 4, Bill, "AN ACT Raising the Age of Persons who may Purchase Alcoholic Beverages or Sell as Licensees."

Amend said Amendment by striking out in the 6th line the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Amendment by striking out in the 11th line the underlined figure "20th" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19th'

Further amend said Amendment by striking out in the 19th and 25th lines the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Amendment by striking out in the 4th, 10th and 19th lines before the Statement of Fact the underlined figure "20" and inserting in place thereof the underlined figure '19'

Further amend said Amendment by striking out all of the last line before the Statement of Fact and inserting in place thereof the following:

'by the commission.

Sec. 11. Effective date. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 1976.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to lower the age from 20 years to 19 years for persons who may purchase alcoholic beverages or sell as licensees. This amendment also provides that the Act shall take effect on January 1, 1976.
