**RESOLVE, to Reimburse Mrs. Betty Mills of Portland for Damage to
Property caused by Escapees from the Boys Training Center.**

Mrs. Betty Mills, reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$915 to be paid to Mrs. Betty Mills of Portland, as a full and final settlement of her claim against the State for property damage by escapees from the Boys Training Center.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On the night of September 6, 1974, two escapees from the Boy's Training Center, South Portland, stole a 1969 Sunbeam Alpine coupe automobile belonging to Mrs. Betty Mills from the driveway of her home at 1527 Westbrook Street, Portland, and drove the car to New Hampshire. When police attempted to stop the car, the escapees attempted to outrace the police and this resulted in an accident in which the car was wrecked. Mrs. Mills did not have theft insurance and therefore suffered a total loss. The car was valued at \$850. The cost of car rental for a week was \$65. The total loss to Mrs. Mills was therefore \$915.
