RESOLVE, Providing Funds for the Lumberman's Museum in Patten, Maine.

Lumberman's Museum; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Lumberman's Museum in Patten, Maine, the sum of \$3,000 to aid in the renovation of a forestry building which has recently been purchased from the State.

This renovation will provide a reception office, repair and workshop and display room for this museum which has the finest collection of tools and implements used in the lumbering industry of Maine in existence today.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This museum, the creation of Dr. Lore Rogers, who is presently in his 100th year and still active as the curator of the museum, is a nonprofit museum, located in the Town of Patten, the gateway to the north woods during the period of the 19th century lumbering industry. The museum has recently purchased the forestry building, which is adjacent to the museum, and intends to use the building for supporting facilities of the museum.
