AN ACT to Provide for Reimbursement of Election
Expenses in Unorganized Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 21 MRSA, § 1581, is enacted to read:

§ 1581. Reimbursement of election expense

The Secretary of State shall reimburse unorganized towns for all expenses incurred in the conduct of elections.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$2,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to provide for the continuous reimbursement of unorganized towns by the Secretary of State for expenses of conducting elections. Moneys collected by poll tax were used for this purpose until the tax was repealed.
