STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Lowering the Maximum Age of Juvenile Offenders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- 15 MRSA, § 2502, sub-§ 4, as amended by PL 1973, c. 351, is further amended to read:
- 4. Juvenile offender. "Juvenile offender" means any child under #8 17 years of age who has been found by an appropriate juvenile court to have committed any of the acts or offenses specified in chapters 401 to 409.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to lower the maximum age of juvenile offenders from 18 to 17 years of age.
