STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Grants-in-aid for Construction and Maintenance of Public Facilities for Boats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

38 MRSA, § 325, first ¶, as amended by PL 1973, c. 460, § 19, is further amended to read:

The Director of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation may make grants-inaid to political subdivisions and others for the construction and maintenance of boat facilities and supporting facilities, on such terms as he determines necessary.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Existing law provides for grants-in-aid to political subdivisions for the construction and maintenance of boating facilities. It is apparent that other agencies such as civic groups, fish and game clubs, as well as other landowners can and are willing to contribute to public access facilities through use of their lands with minimum assistance from the State.
