COMMITTEE AMENDMENT" A" to S.P. 62, L.D. 181, Bill, "AN ACT to Eliminate the 5-Year Residency Requirement for Persons Seeking a License to Operate an Employment Agency."

Amend said Bill in the title by striking out the word "Eliminate" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'Reduce'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Each application shall be accompanied by the affidavits of 2 persons who have known the applicant, or the chief officers thereof if a corporation, for 2 years at least, stating that the applicant is or said officers are of good moral character and a resident or residents of the State and has or have been such for at least **5-years** 6 months prior to the date of such application.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this committee amendment is to reduce the residency requirement for employment agency operators from 5 years to 6 months. The original bill had eliminated the durational requirement altogether, requiring only residency at the time of application for a license.
