STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Allowing Licensees under the Liquor Laws more Control over Licensed Premises.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

17 MRSA, § 3854, sub-§ 5, is enacted to read:

5. Illegally enters or refuses to vacate. Whoever enters or refuses or fails after being warned to leave the premises of the holder of a license issued by the commission or the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages when requested to do so by the licensee himself, clerk, servant or his agent shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow licensees under the liquor laws more control over their licensed premises.
