AN ACT Eliminating the Need for a License to Sell
Prophylactic Rubber Goods.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §§ 1131-1143 are repealed.

Sec. 2. **Transitional provision.** All balances in the prophylactic licensing account are hereby transferred to the General Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act implements Management and Cost Survey Recommendation No. 30, Department of Health and Welfare. Fees generated from sale of these licenses amount to less than \$500 annually. Services, inspections and controls rendered are minimal. Elimination of this requirement for a license will remove an obsolete function from the Bureau of Health. The accumulated balance in the prophylactic licensing account is \$6,740.
