STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Changing the Name of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy to
Col. Hennessey Criminal Justice Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA, § 2801, as last repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 136, § 1, is amended to read:

§ 2801. **Col. Hennessey Criminal Justice Academy**

There is created a law enforcement and criminal justice training facility to be known as the "~~Maine~~ **Col. Hennessey Criminal Justice Academy**" which shall be established at some convenient and suitable place in the Augusta area as the board of trustees, hereinafter established, may determine.

Sec. 2. 25 MRSA, § 2805, sub-§ 1, first sentence, as last repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 672, § 1, is amended to read:

As a condition to the continued employment of any person as a full-time law enforcement officer by a municipality or county, said person shall successfully complete, within the first year of his employment, a basic training course at the ~~Maine~~ **Col. Hennessey Criminal Justice Academy**.

Sec. 3. 25 MRSA, § 2805, sub-§ 3, first sentence, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 136, § 3, is further amended to read:

As a condition to the continued employment of any person as a full-time local law enforcement officer by any municipality or county, said person shall be enrolled in an in-service training program conducted by the police agency

by which he is employed, the ~~Maine~~ **Col. Hennessey** Criminal Justice Academy or a program approved by the board of trustees.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to rename the Criminal Justice Academy in honor of its founder, the late Col. Parker F. Hennessey.
