# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT to Increase the Maximum Weekly Benefit under the Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA, § 1191, sub-§ 2, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 538, § 21, is further amended to read:

2. Weekly benefit amount for total unemployment. Each eligible individual establishing a benefit year on and after January I, 1972, who is totally unemployed in any week shall be paid with respect to such week benefits equal to  $\frac{1}{22}$  I/Ig of the wages, rounded to the nearest dollar, paid to him in the high quarter of his base period, but not less than \$12. The maximum weekly benefit amount for claimants requesting insured status determination from June 1st of a calendar year to May 31st of the next calendar year shall not exceed  $\frac{52\%}{66\%}$  of the annual average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest highest dollar, paid in the calendar year preceding June 1st of such calendar year.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

The basic thrust of this bill is to change the maximum weekly benefit under the Employment Security Law from 52% of the employee's average weekly wage to  $66^2/_3\%$  of the average weekly wage.
