IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Delete the Requirement that Taverns Serve Men Only.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA, § 2, sub-§ 22, first sentence, as amended by PL 1973, c. 193, is further amended to read:

“Tavern” shall mean a reputable place ~~for men only~~ operated by responsible persons where no food is sold, other than prepared packaged foods, and bar snacks, and no business is carried on except the sale of cigarettes and tobacco products and except the sale of malt liquor at a bar.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act would extend another right of citizenship to the female populace of the State of Maine. This would allow women to enter and make purchases in taverns.
