IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Limit the Prohibition against Issuing Trappers' Licenses to
Persons Convicted of Certain Offenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

¹² MRSA, § 2402, 13th ¶, as last repealed and replaced by PL 1971, c. 231, § 9, is amended to read:

Any person who has been found guilty of breaking and entering, or of larceny, shall not be eligible ~~thereafter~~ to obtain a trapper's license ~~within 2~~ years of the date of said conviction.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The change is to alleviate the hardship caused by the present law which assesses a lifetime prohibition upon the holding of a trapper's license for conviction of certain offenses and to limit the penalty to 2 years from the date of the conviction.
