STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Concerning Appeals from Redetermination of Unemployment Compensation Claims.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA, § 1194, sub-§ 10, 2nd ¶, last sentence, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 538, § 33, is further amended to read:

Subject to the provisions of subsection II, unless the claimant files an appeal from such redetermination within 7 15 calendar days after such notification redetermination was mailed to his last known address, such redetermination shall be final.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act establishes that a redetermination of a claim for employment compensation shall be final unless the claimant files an appeal within 15 days after the redetermination was mailed to him. This bill makes the appeal period provided by section 1194, subsection 10, consistent with that provided by section 1194, subsection 2, which concerns determination of claims.
