Amend said Amendment by inserting at the end of section
8-A the following:

Further amend said Amendment by inserting at the end
of section 9 the following:

| <u>Permits any person serving in</u> <u>the Armed Forces of the United States</u> <u>who is permanently stationed at</u> <u>a military or naval post, station or</u> <u>base within the State, that person's</u> <u>spouse and that person's minor</u> <u>children to fish during the season</u> <u>for which the license is issued.</u> | |

Statement of Fact

This amendment establishes a special big game hunting
license category, with a license fee of \$29.50, which permits big
game hunting by any person serving in the Armed Forces of the
United States who is permanently stationed at a military or naval
post, station or base within this State, and by his spouse and
children. This amendment also establishes a seasonal fishing
license category, with a license fee of \$10.50, for the same class
of serviceman.
