STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Increase Certain Hunting and Fishing License Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA, § 2401, sub-§ 3, 4th ¶, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 276, is further amended to read:

The following schedule of fees is established:

A. Resident junior hunting 10-16 years of age

\$1.50

B. Resident hunting 16 years of age or older

\$6.50

C. Junior nonresident hunting

\$12.50 \$17.50

10-16 years of age
Permits hunting of all species except deer and bear.
Application shall be accompanied by the written consent of his or her parent or guardian.

D. Resident combination hunting and fishing

\$10.50

E. Nonresident small game hunting

Permits hunting of all species except bear and deer

\$22.50

F. Nonresident big game hunting
Permits hunting for all species including bear and deer.

\$46.50 \$65.50

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall become effective January 1, 1976.

FISCAL NOTE

Enactment of this bill would increase revenue to the State by \$460,000 annually.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase certain hunting and fishing license fees.
