IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Require Apprentice Hairdressers to Practice Hairdressing under the Supervision of a Registered Instructor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA § 1651, 2nd ¶, is amended to read:

No apprentice hairdresser may independently practice hairdressing but he may, as an apprentice, do any or all acts constituting the practice of hairdressing under the immediate personal supervision of a registered ~~hairdresser~~ **instructor**, and only one such apprentice shall be employed in any licensed hairdressing shop.

Sec. 2. Application. This Act shall not apply to any apprentice hairdresser who is practicing hairdressing under the immediate personal supervision of a registered hairdresser on the effective date of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Since an instructor's license is required to teach in a beauty school, it is felt that an apprentice should have the benefit of learning from a person holding an instructor's license.
