## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 107TH LEGISLATURE

SENATE AMENDMENT"A" to S.P. 205, L.D. 695, Bill, "AN ACT to Prevent Hunting in Areas Near Dumps in Unorganized Territories and Plantations of the State."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the end of the last paragraph before the statement of fact, the following new sentences:

'The boundary of any area in which hunting is prohibited under this paragraph shall be marked by the county commissioners of the county in which the dump is located in such manner as prescribed by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game and shall be posted conspicuously with signs or other markings approved by the commissioner. These signs shall be of a color, size and wording prescribed by the commissioner and shall be placed not more than 250 feet apart so as to face the outside of the area in which hunting is prohibited.'

## Statement of Fact

This amendment provides that "no hunting areas surrounding dumps in the unorganized territories and plantations shall be conspicuously marked so that hunters will know those areas in which they are forbidden to hunt.
