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AN ACT Establishing Mandatory Sentences Upon Conviction of Trafficking  
in Illegal Drugs.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA § 2380, last ¶ is amended to read:

~~Except in the case of conviction for a first offense for violation of this chapter~~ Upon conviction, the imposition or execution of a sentence shall not be suspended. Parole shall not be granted until the minimum imprisonment herein provided for the offense shall have been served.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA § 2389 is enacted to read:

§ 2389. Mandatory sentencing if convicted of trafficking in illegal drugs

When a person is convicted of a violation of sections 2210, 2210-A, 2212-C, 2212-E, 2262-C or 2384, the imposition and execution of the prescribed sentence shall not be suspended and probation shall not be granted.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to establish mandatory sentences upon conviction of trafficking in illegal drugs.
