STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Require Driver's License Renewal Examinations at Age 55 and Older.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA § 545, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1969, c. 137, is amended to read:

Any person who has reached his 65th 55th birthday and who has not taken a vision examination to qualify him to operate a motor vehicle within the past year shall be required to pass the vision portion of a driver's examination before a license shall be issued to him; except that any person who applies for and receives a license to operate a motor vehicle effective on his 64th 54th birthday shall not be required to take such examination until and unless he applies for renewal thereof to be effective on his 66th 56th birthday. Any person who secures a motor vehicle operator's license at either age 65 55 or 66 56, as detailed, must pass the vision portion of a driver's examination at such times thereafter as he shall apply for renewal thereof.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 1976.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this Act is to require a vision test at age 55 before obtaining a driver's license.
