AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Lobsters in York River, County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P&SL 1059, c. 155, § 130, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sec. 130. Taking of lobsters in York River regulated. No person except the harbor master, who may remove traps within the channel, shall catch, take, set lobster traps or trap lobsters in York River, York County, from its source to a straight line starting at the easternmost point of Fort Point and running in a southerly direction passing through United States Coast Guard Buoy Number 6 to the southerly shore of York Harbor entrance. The Commissioner of Marine Resources shall provide appropriate markers at each terminus and one other intermediate marker on land to provide suitable sighting.

Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$50.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to establish a "lobster line" for the taking of lobsters in the York River, County of York.
