# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Reports Required by Municipal Ordinance of Developers of Shoreland Areas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 4812-A, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 564, § 4, is amended by adding a new paragraph at the end to read:

Where ordinances which relate to shoreland areas require a soils suitability report concerning subsurface waste disposal or commercial or industrial development or other intensive land use, such report may be prepared by a soils scientist, geologist or registered professional engineer, and shall be based on an on-site inspection.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow registered professional engineers, as well as soils scientists and geologists, to make soils suitability reports in shoreland areas where such reports are required by ordinance.
