STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Make Assault on a Police Officer a Felony.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

17 MRSA § 204 is enacted to read:

§ 204. Assault and battery on a police officer

Whoever unlawfully attempts to strike, hit, touch or do any violence to a state, county or municipal law enforcement official however small, in a wanton, willful, angry or insulting manner, having an intention and existing ability to do some violence to that law enforcement official, is guilty of the felony of assault on a law enforcement official. If that attempt is carried into effect, he is guilty of the felony of assault and battery on a law enforcement official. Any person convicted of either offense, when it is not of a high and aggravated nature, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$500 or by imprisonment for not less than 60 days, or by both. When the offense is of a high and aggravated nature, the person convicted of either offense shall be punished by a fine of not less than 120 days, or by both.

STATEMENT OF FACT

There has been a vast increase in the number of assaults on police officers within the past few years. A police officer is an expensive official to maintain, and when an officer is laid up with an injury, it is difficult and costly to obtain a replacement. It is currently a felony to assault a federal police officer. This Act will make it a felony to assault any police officer.
