IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Specify the Future Use of Certain Lands in the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Dedication of certain lands for park purposes. The City of Portland is authorized and empowered to dedicate the hereinafter described property for perpetual use as park lands, such property having been acquired by condemnation or through the expenditure of public funds by a majority vote of its City Council. Such property, if so dedicated, shall remain and be used solely for park purposes in perpetuity.

Sec. 2. Description. This Act refers only to those certain pieces or parcels of land located in the City of Portland, comprising areas therein commonly known as the Eastern and Western Promenades and shown more particularly as highlighted on the attached plat marked Exhibit "A", which plat is expressly made a part hereof.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would allow the perpetual dedication by the City of Portland of property known as the Eastern and Western Promenades for park purposes.
