STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Increasing the Maximum State Payment for Grade Sheep Killed
by Dogs or Wild Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

7 MRSA § 3652, last sentence, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 96, is amended to read:

Payment shall not exceed ~~\$30~~ \$50 for grade sheep, goats or swine, or \$100 for registered sheep, goats or swine.

STATEMENT OF FACT

At present, the State pays \$30 for good grade sheep killed by dogs or wild animals. It is presently very difficult to raise or buy good grade sheep at this price and this bill will increase the maximum payment to a more realistic figure of \$50.
