STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Authorize Removal of Dam on Bond Brook in Augusta in Order to Remove a Danger to Playing Children and to Permit Anadromous Fish to Ascend that Brook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Dam at Bond Brook; removal; appropriation. The National Guard of the State of Maine is authorized and respectfully requested to remove the dam located on Bond Brook at the point where that brook is surrounded by the property of Mr. O'Neill Lajoie, which is located in the City of Augusta, Kennebec County. The National Guard of the State of Maine is further authorized and respectfully requested to remove sufficient ledge on the site of the dam to allow anadromous fish to ascend Bond Brook at that point and also to erect a retaining wall to protect a building erected on the site of the mill adjacent to that dam. It is also respectfully requested that this project be accomplished as a summer training project during the summer of 1976. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Military Bureau of the Department of Military, Civil Emergency Preparedness and Veterans Services the sum of \$5,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will provide for the removal of the dam and of ledge in Bond Brook in Augusta and for the erection of a suitable retaining wall in order to remove a danger to children playing in the area and to allow anadromous fish to ascend Bond Brook. This removal and construction is to be accomplished as part of a Maine National Guard summer training project during the summer months of 1976.
