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### AN ACT Relating to the Retirement Pay of Court Reporters.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

4 MRSA § 651-A is enacted to read:

§ 651-A. Retirement pay of court reporters

Any official court reporter of the State of Maine may retire upon the completion of 20 years of creditable service, be placed upon the pension rolls and receive thereafter, annually, during the remainder of his or her life an amount equal to 50% of the currently effective annual salaries of an official court reporter to be paid in the same manner as the salaries of the official court reporters are paid. This section shall apply only to persons who were serving as official court reporters on January 1, 1974, and shall not apply to persons now serving who have had 25 years of prior service as official court reporters.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this Act is to improve the retirement pension for official court reporters.
