## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 107TH LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT" A "to S.P. 290, L.D. 1015, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Special Agency Stores."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 5th line (3rd line in L.D.) the underlined words "cities and towns" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'cities, towns and unorganized townships'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after that part designated "§153." and before the Fiscal Note the following:

'1. The State Liquor Commission shall establish rules and regulations for the operation of the special agency retail stores. These rules and regulations shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Storage facilities for alcoholic beverages, the handling and sale of alcoholic beverages, the extent of the geographical area or the size of the population to be served by special agency stores, the hours of operation, the size and nature of the facilities of the special agency stores and any other rules and regulations that the State Liquor Commission deems necessary to carry out the purpose of this section.

The State Liquor Commission shall hold public hearings in communities in which special agency stores are to be established and by majority vote issue a permit to the owner of such retail store which can most conveniently and best serve the public. If, in the opinion of the State Liquor Commission, there are several retail stores that have adequate facilities, are located in a convenient location and can fulfill the rules and regulations established by the commission, and the commission is unable to make a choice, the special agency store shall be chosen by lot.

Any retail food store may appeal a decision made by the State Liquor Commission to the Administrative Court Judge in accordance with Title 5, chapters 301-307. If any person, firm, corporation or association is aggrieved by the decision of the Administrative Court Judge, he or she may appeal such decision to the Superior Court in accordance with the provisions of Title 5, chapter 307.

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide standards and a procedure for the creation of special agency stores, to provide for hearings and an appeal process required by law, to place the responsibility of creating such special agency stores with the State Liquor Commission and to include the unorganized townships under the provisions of this Act.
