COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 848, L.D. 1035, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify Certain Provisions of the Maine Right to Know Law."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of sections 4 and 5.

Further amend said Bill in section 6 by striking out in the 5th line (same in L.D.) the underlined word "shall" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'may'

Further amend said Bill in section 6 by striking out in the 4th line from the end (same in L.D.) the underlined word "shall" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'may'

Further amend said Bill in section 7 by striking out all of the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following: 'Nothing contained in this subchapter shall be construed as abridging the right of any citizen or citizens to appeal to a court of this State for the enforcement of the rights provided for in said subchapter.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering sections to read consecutively.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to clarify the law.
