IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Certain License Requirements for Class A Restaurants
under the State Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 2, sub-§ 18, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th sentences, as amended, are repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow restaurants in smaller communities that are unable to meet the dollar volume requirements to be eligible for a Class A restaurant liquor license while still maintaining a 60% food volume requirement.
