IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Original Drivers' Licenses Issued to Persons 18 Years of Age or Older who Have Successfully Completed a State Approved Driver Education Course.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

29 MRSA § 2241, last ¶, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 361, is amended by adding after the first sentence, the following new sentences:

However, the provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to any person who is 18 years of age or older and who has successfully completed either a driver education course and examination given by the public secondary schools and academies receiving tuition students as described in Title 20, section 1291, or a driver education course and examination given by some person or persons licensed by the Secretary of State. Such a person shall be issued a nonprovisional license valid for a period until the 2nd birthdate after issue.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act provides that a nonprovisional license shall be issued as an original license to any person who is 18 years of age or older and who has successfully completed a driver's education course approved by the State.
