STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Grant Full Retirement Benefits to All Members of the Maine State Retirement System After 30 Years Creditable Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA § 1095, first sentence, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 542, § 1, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Each member shall make a contribution of 8.0% of earnable compensation.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA § 1121, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, first sentence, is amended to read:

Any member who at the attainment of age 60 is in service has attained 30 years of creditable service may retire at any time then or thereafter on a service retirement allowance upon written application to the board of trustees setting forth at what time he desires to be retired.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Retirement System for the fiscal year 1975 the sum of \$2,773,777 to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This Act is to grant full retirement benefits to all members of the Maine State Retirement System after 30 years of creditable service without regard to age. It is intended to encourage earlier retirement of state employees and teachers which could have the effect of reducing the overall cost of salaries to the State.
