## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Repeal Provision for Lighted Headlamp on Motorcycles Using the Highway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

29 MRSA § 999, first ¶, as amended by PL 1973, c. 650, is further amended to read:

In addition to the requirements of this chapter, motorcycles and motor driven cycles shall be operated on the highway with a lighted headlamp on when in motion and in such manner that no more than 2 such vehicles shall be operated abreast within the same lane of operation.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act will repeal provision for motorcycles being required to be operated with a lighted headlight on when in motion on the highway. This provision is unduly restrictive since many motorcycles are not equipped for such lighting.
