STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Authorize Class A Taverns to Serve Spirituous and Vinous Liquors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 28 MRSA § 2, sub-§ 22-A, 1st sentence, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 152, is further amended to read:

"Class A tavern" shall mean a reputable place operated by responsible persons of good reputation where food may be sold **and spirituous**, vinous and malt liquors **or malt liquors only** are sold at tables, booths and counters, and where no minors shall be permitted to remain on the licensed premises.

Sec. 2. 28 MRSA § 101, sub-§ 3-A is enacted to read:

3-A. Shall licenses be granted in this municipality or unincorporated place for the sale herein of wine and spirits to be consumed on the premises of class A taverns where malt liquor is presently permitted to be sold?

Sec. 3. 28 MRSA § 701, 2nd ¶, as last amended by PL 1971, c. 222, § 2, is further amended by inserting after the 16th line the following:

Sec. 4. Transition. The first election to be held on the question contained in section 2 shall be held at the next state-wide special or general election following the effective date of this Act and the question specified in section 2 of this Act shall be placed on the ballot to be voted on by the electors of each municipality or unincorporated place in this State in which class A taverns are presently permitted to sell malt liquor.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes class A taverns to serve spirituous and vinous liquors in any municipality currently permitting class A taverns to sell malt liquor which vote affirmatively to permit that service, provided that the taverns purchase a license to serve spirituous and vinous liquors and provided they comply with all other aspects of the statutes concerning alcoholic beverages.
