AN ACT to Grant Counties Certain Powers to Enter on Lands and to  
Contract with the Federal Government and other Bodies.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

30 MRSA § 60 is enacted to read:

§ 60. General grant of powers

1. Right of entry; surveys. County commissioners or designated county employees shall have the power to enter on any lands, water or premises located within or without the county to make surveys, borings, soundings or examinations for county purposes.

2. Contracts with the Federal Government and other bodies. The Board of County Commissioners of each county shall have the power to enter into contracts with the Government of the United States or any agency or instrumentality thereof, with the State or any agency or instrumentality thereof, or with any other county, district, private corporation, copartnership, association or individual providing for or relating to revenue producing county facilities.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to authorize county commissioners or certain county employees to enter on lands or waters to make surveys and examinations for county purposes and to authorize the board of county commissioners of each county to enter into contracts concerning revenue producing county facilities with certain bodies, including the Federal Government.
