CONFERENCE COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 965, L.D. 1209, Bill, "AN ACT to Facilitate Operation of the Coastal Island Registry and to Establish Criteria for State Title in Coastal Islands."

in section 13
Amend said Bill/by striking out all of that part designated
"§1218." and inserting in place thereof the following:
'§1218. Fraudulent registration

Any person who knowingly registers a coastal island, not being the true owner of such island, with the intent of fraudulently obtaining an interest in such island, or with the purpose of deceiving the State as to ownership of such island or to otherwise deceive, deprive, obtain or misrepresent ownership of such island shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Title 17, section 1603-A, fraud against the State.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to bring the penalty for fraudulent island registry into conformity with that for other frauds against the State.
