STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing a Minimum Service Retirement Allowance under the State Retirement Law for Clyde R. Chapman.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 107th Legislature in regular session provided for a minimum service retirement allowance for state employees and teachers of \$100 per month, if the member had 10 years of creditable service at retirement; and

Whereas, Clyde R. Chapman served 16 years prior to the effective date of such law; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide Clyde R. Chapman a minimum service retirement allowance of \$100 per month; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Clyde R. Chapman; retirement credit for state service. Resolved: That not withstanding any other provisions of law, the Maine State Retirement System is directed to pay Clyde R. Chapman the minimum retirement allowance of \$100 per month as provided under the State Retirement Law.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Clyde Chapman was employed by the Legislature as Clerk of the House, serving 1919-1933. He also served as the State Attorney General from 1933-1937. His total service covered 16 years.
