AN ACT Providing a Minimum Service Retirement Allowance under the State Retirement Law for Leonard Sprague of Machias.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Leonard Sprague; creditable state service; authorized. Leonard Sprague of Machias shall be provided with a minimum retirement benefit of not less than \$100 per month during his lifetime.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$2,400 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

Leonard Sprague was employed by the State for 13 years, 7 months and 17 days prior to July 1, 1942, but was not a contributing member of the Retirement System.

If Leonard Sprague had worked at least one day after July 1, 1942 and had become a contributing member of the Retirement System, he would have been credited for such prior service and would be receiving a retirement allowance.

The following legislation is vitally necessary to alleviate an inequity by which Leonard Sprague is excluded from the current retirement system provisions.
