#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Concerning the Time Period after the Last Permitted Sale of Liquor During which a Licensee may Permit the Consumption of Liquor on his Premises.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 4, 5th sentence, is amended to read:

Except as hereafter provided, no licensee shall permit the consumption of liquors on his premises on Sundays, or after 45 60 minutes past the hours prohibited for sale thereof, except by bona fide guests in their rooms.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act extends from 15 minutes to 60 minutes the time period after the last permitted sale of liquor during which a licensee may permit the consumption of liquor on his premises.
