HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 418, L.D. 1375, Bill,
"AN ACT to Clarify Certain Provisions in the Education Laws."

Amend said Bill by adding at the end before the Statement
of Fact the following:

'Sec. 35. 32 MRSA § 3505, first sentence, as last amended
by PL 1975, c. 118, §3, is further amended to read:

Any person who has been registered with the board for at least
2 years as an apprentice or trainee plumber, or who has
satisfactorily completed one academic year in a recognized full
time school of plumbing, or any person qualified under Title 20,
section 2361, or who has served as a registered or licensed
apprentice or trainee plumber in another state for at least
2 years shall, upon payment of a fee of \$3, be entitled to
examination and, if found qualified by a majority of the members
of the board, shall be licensed as a journeyman plumber and shall
receive a certificate thereof under the seal of the board and
with the signature of the executive officer, which shall state the
facts, and which shall be carried on the person and displayed at
any time upon request.

Sec. 36. Effective date. Section 35 of this Act shall
become effective 91 days after the adjournment of the Legislature.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that any person
qualified under Title 20, section 2361 is entitled to
examination for a license as a journeyman plumber.
