HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1118, L.D. 1415, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Commercial Fishing and the Increase of Certain License Fees Issued by the Department of Marine Resources."

Amend said amendment by striking out in the next to the last line of the first paragraph the underlined figure "18" and inserting in place thereof the following: '17'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the 3rd paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 21. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$368,200 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
