IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Require Lane Markings on Highways and Roads to be Yellow.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA § 961 is enacted to read:

§ 961. Lane markings

All markings which are painted or otherwise affixed upon the surface of any highway or road in this State, in order to divide that highway or road into lanes or to control traffic on that road or highway, or both, shall be of the color yellow.

Sec. 2. **Transition.** Lane markings existing at the effective date of this Act which are not yellow shall be left in their original color, but when those markings are repainted or replaced in the normal course of maintenance, they shall be painted yellow or replaced with markings which are yellow.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that all lane markings painted or affixed to the surface of every road and highway in this State shall be yellow.
