STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Prohibit the Sale of Salmon by Anyone Not a Commercial Producer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2751, 1st sentence is amended to read:

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or buy, directly or indirectly, any landlocked salmon, trout, togue, black bass, white perch or pickerel, except that pickerel may be sold in Washington County.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the sale of any salmon in this State unless the salmon has been produced by commercial producers within or without the State. This prohibition will help remove the monetary incentive for poaching of salmon which are returning from the sea to rivers and streams to spawn.
