COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1197, L.D. 1493, Bill, "AN ACT Concerning Home Repair Salesman Licenses Issued by the Department of Business Regulation."

Amend said bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'9 MRSA §3742, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 585, §11, is is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
§3742. Licensee's name and location; changes; home repair salesman's license

1. Licensee's name and location; changes; home repair salesman's license. Except as provided in subsection 2, no licensee shall transact any business subject to this chapter under any other name or maintain an office at any other location than that designated in the license. In case such location be changed, the superintendent shall endorse the change of location on the license without charge.

2. License of home repair salesman not to contain contractor's name or address. The license of a home repair salesman in the employ of a home repair contractor shall not contain or state the name and address of such home repair contractor.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to allow home repair salesmen who have left the employ of a contractor to continue

to use their licenses either on their own or in the employ of another. By not having the employer's name and address on the salesman's license, a salesman who has left a contractor's employ could not easily continue to represent himself as an employee.
