SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 458, L.D. 1512, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Issuing of Fishing and Hunting Licenses."

Amend said Bill by inserting after the enacting clause
the following:

'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §2401-B, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1971,
c. 409, §2, is repealed and the following enacted in place
thereof:

4. Holders of Congressional Medal of Honor; complimentary
licenses. The Governor may grant 2-year complimentary hunting
and fishing licenses to holders of the Congressional Medal of
Honor, upon their application therefor.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of
the first line after the enacting clause the underlined
abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 2.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to repeal the statutory
provision stating that employees of the Veterans Administration
residing in Maine and employed by the Togus facility are to be
classified as Maine residents for the purpose of obtaining
fishing licenses and providing that the Governor may grant
complimentary hunting and fishing licenses to certain members
of the Canadian Immigration Customs Forces. This amendment
leaves in the statutes a provision allowing the Governor to
award complimentary hunting and fishing licenses to certain
medal of honor winners.
