## AN ACT Providing Funds to Community Mental Health Centers to Offset Reduced Federal Grants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Bureau of Mental Health, Department of Mental Health and Corrections, the sum of \$559,154 to be used as grant-in-aid funds to assist those community mental health centers which have declining federal grants. The breakdown shall be as follows:

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The Federal Community Mental Health Centers Act provides staffing grants to community mental health centers on a declining fund basis over an 8-year period. These grants generally do not apply to all staff members of a center and require a percentage of local funds to support those staff members included in the grant. Centers in designated poverty areas receive 90%

federal funds in the first year of the staffing grant, decreasing to 65% by the 8th year. Centers in nonpoverty areas receive 75% federal funds in the first year, decreasing to 30% by the 8th year. Federal funds for individual community mental health centers in the coming biennium will be reduced by: Aroostook Mental Health Center, \$40,110; the Counseling Center (Bangor), \$90,260; Kennebec Valley Mental Health Center \$72,600; Tricounty Mental Health Services, \$298,419 and York County Counseling Services, \$57,765.

The funds requested are necessary to maintain the current level of service while continued funding and reimbursement mechanisms are being developed at the federal and state levels.
